



Festive Star Garland Project Instructions

Please note:

Due to warm surfaces, children must be supervised at all times for this project.

Recommended for ages 4+

Materials Needed:

Thick, plain paper (shirt cardboard, cardstock, paper grocery bags)

Clementine Natural Soy Crayons

Clementine Natural Glue and glitter (optional)

Scissors (pinking shears are fun too)

Embroidery floss

Embroidery needle (with large eye)

Pompoms (or buttons, wool felt balls, cranberries, popcorn)

Warming Tray covered with tin foil, set to LOW

Kitchen tongs

Give it a Try:

1. Cut some stars out of heavy paper using scissors or pinking shears. Let your child help – wonky stars are more fun.
2. Draw on the warm foil with Clementine natural soy crayons. Lay the white stars on the melted wax. Remove from the warming tray with tongs. Make as many stars as you'd like, and let them cool/dry.
3. String some bright embroidery floss on a large-eye needle. Double it and tie a knot in the end.
4. Alternate 'sewing' the stars and pompoms (or other embellishment) onto the string using the needle. Poke the needle right through the middle of the star, then through the middle of the pompom. Don't worry, the challenge is good for developing strength and coordination in little fingers. *Note: Children should always be supervised when sewing.*
5. Hang your garland in your child's room, in the window or on the tree and ENJOY!
